BRETT'S TWO-CENTS

Hello, everyone! Did you ever wonder why our Catholic faith talks about two judgments, the particular judgment that we all must undergo at the moment of our death, and the Final Judgment when Christ returns at the end of time to “separate the goats from the sheep?” Someone asked me this week, “why two judgments?” And “can the particular and Final judgments contradict one another with regard to the same person?” Let’s take a look!

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, citing St. John of the Cross, notes that “at the evening of life, we shall be judged on our love” (§1022). Each of us, at the moment of our death, must stand before the Lord and give an account of our life. This encounter with Christ we call the “particular judgment,” and the result of this judgment is either entry into eternal bliss (“heaven”), eternal damnation (“hell”), or further refinement of our love in preparation for heaven (“purgatory”). Interestingly, when speaking of this judgment, some of the early Church Fathers identify us ourselves as our own judges as we stand in the presence of Him who is pure Love and Truth, but more about that next week. For our purposes this week, the important thing to remember is that all of us must render an account of our lives to God when we die, and it is in this particular encounter that our eternal destinies are decided. In other words, the subject of this particular judgment is the individual person.

There is also, however, a Final Judgment that will occur at the end of time, when Christ returns to pronounce judgment on all of history, to defeat forever the powers of Evil, and to establish definitively that glorious kingdom in which there will be “no more death or mourning, wailing or pain.” Here, the focus is not so much on individual destiny as it is on the destiny of all of Creation. And it’s not that the destiny of Creation is up for grabs, as if Christ is an impartial judge who will condemn Creation if he doesn’t like what he sees. Rather, Christ is the rightful King of Creation who returns to reclaim what is his, to restore it to its original power and beauty, to rescue it forever from the powers of sin, death, and destruction. Those who have sought entry into his Kingdom through love of God and their neighbor will be welcomed; those who have opposed his Kingdom through love of self will be cast out. Thus, you might say that the Final judgment is the fitting of the individual into the larger picture. “In the presence of Christ, who is Truth itself, the truth of each (person’s) relationship with God will be laid bare” for all to see (§1039). It’s not that we are “re-judged,” as if we had to undergo another particular judgment, but rather that our particular destiny is fitted into the larger destiny of the world. More on the Final Judgment in two weeks!

In reply, Jesus tells the story of the Good Samaritan, a story in which a Samaritan is the neighbor - the story of the story! And because, at that time, Samaritans and Jews were enemies, it was really hard for the lawyer to accept this teaching. The lesson here, is that the love of neighbor embraces all, Samaritan, Jew - everyone.

How can you make them feel that they are your neighbor?*

TREATING INJURIES: Despite your best efforts, injuries sometimes happen. So if you strain, pull or irritate something, remember RICE:

 **REST:** Stop exercising. Don't "play through" your injuries.

 **ICE:** Immediately place an ice pack on the injured area for 20 minutes out of each hour for the first day or two after the injury.

 **COMPRESSION.** Wrap the injured area in an Ace bandage.

 **ELEVATE:** Try to keep the injured area higher than your heart so that blood won't pool there.

In addition, you can take over-the-counter painkillers such as aspirin and ibuprofen to reduce the swelling. After 24 to 48 hours of following the RICE routine, gently stretch the injured area. Stop before it becomes painful.
