BRETT'S TWO-CENTS

Hello, everyone! This week we finish up looking at the destinies and destinations of the 12 Apostles. By the way, if you're interested in more in-depth reflections on the 12, be sure to check out Pope Benedict's *The Apostles*, a collection of brief instructions that he gave during his Wednesday morning audiences when he first became Pope. Today, we'll look at Thomas, Matthew, Jude, Simon, and Matthias.

Thomas: Unfortunately known best as "Doubting Thomas," Thomas actually went on to become a courageous preacher of the Gospel after Pentecost. He is reported to have preached in Iran, but is better remembered as the Apostle to India. In fact, most Christians in India today, especially in the State of Kerala, still trace their roots back to him. At the instigation of some powerful Brahmins who felt threatened by the Gospel he preached, Thomas was speared to death by soldiers of a local king on Mt. St. Thomas in the city of Chennai (Madras), Tamil Nadu. His remains were eventually transferred to Edessa (modern day Turkey) before finding their final resting place in Ortona, Italy.

Matthew: Tradition says that Matthew wrote our first gospel, originally in Hebrew, for a group of Jewish Christians. He is supposed to have preached in Judea, northern Greece (Macedonia), and Iran before travelling to Ethiopia, where he was martyred by beheading around the year 60 AD.

Jude: Also known as Thaddeus, Jude was the brother of James the Lesser. A close companion of Simon, Jude apparently travelled with him to Syria, Mesopotamia, and Iran in the service of the Gospel. His exorcisms of demons from pagan idols are frequently mentioned.

Interestingly, Jude is said to have carried the burial cloth of Christ (the Shroud of Turin) with him as he preached, which could explain why he is often depicted carrying a circular image of Christ, i.e. the Shroud when folded up into a case with a window that shows just the face. There is a legend that says when Jude opened the shroud to cure King Abgar of Edessa of his illness, both Jude and the image became radiant with light, which is why Jude is traditionally depicted with a tongue of flame on his head.

Jude was apparently clubbed to death, then beheaded in Iran.

Simon: Little is known about Simon, also known as "Simon the Zealot." He is supposed to have preached in the vicinity of the Black Sea, in Egypt, North Africa, Iran, and Britain. Simon was martyred, but it is uncertain where this happened. Some say he was crucified in Samaria or in Britain. Some say he was sawn in half in Iran. Still others claim he was martyred in modern-day Georgia (the country, not the state!)

And finally, **Matthias:** Chosen to take Judas' place after the Ascension of the Lord, Matthias earned the martyr's crown just as did the other 11. According to tradition, Matthias preached in Judea, Cappadocia, Egypt, and Georgia before being either crucified or stoned in the kingdom of Colchis in Western Georgia around 80 AD. A marker placed in the ruins of the Roman fortress at Gonio (Apsaros) in the modern Georgian region of Adjara claims that Matthias is buried at that site.

JUNE IS MEN'S HEALTH MONTH



"There is a silent health crisis in America ... it's a fact that, on average, men live sicker and die younger than women". On average, men are less healthy and have a shorter life expectancy than women. Part of the reason for this health gap is that men don't take care of themselves as well as women do. Men are more likely to engage in unhealthy behavior, and less likely than women to adopt preventive health measures; as a result, men die younger and in greater numbers from heart disease, stroke, cancer, diabetes, and many other diseases than women. In 1920, women out-lived men by an average of only 1 year. Today, that difference is more than 5 years.

FOR WOMEN ONLY: Why men's health is also a women's issue. What does men's health have to do with you? Plenty! Men's health issues don't affect only men; they have a significant impact on everyone around them. And because women live longer than men, women see their fathers, brothers, sons, and husbands suffer or die prematurely. More than half of premature deaths among men are preventable. By educating yourself about potential male health problems and passing that information on to the men you love, you may be able to save a life. And by encouraging all the men in your life to realize that even the smallest symptoms can sometimes be serious and may need to be discussed with their doctors, you'll be helping them take a more active role in their own health care.
