

FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH: THOUGHTS ON FAITH

It's October! The wide array of the *Saints* that we celebrate this month are some of the most popular (here's an article with 12 of them: <u>bit.ly/Oct-Saints</u>).

On top of that, the entire month of October is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. Why? It was because of what happened during the Battle of Lepanto in 1571, when the Catholic League entered into battle against the Ottoman Empire to protect Italy from invasion. Before the battle, Pope Pius V called all religious communities and the Catholic faithful around Europe to pray the rosary. The Catholic League was vastly outnumbered but went into battle regardless — and each of them carried a rosary (the best weapon ever, especially if you ask Mary to help you). Miraculously, the Catholic League returned victorious!

In thanksgiving for Mary's intercession and protection, Pope Pius V dedicated *October* 7th as the Feast of *Our Lady of the Rosary*. In 1884, *Pope Leo XIII* decreed in his encyclical *Superiore Anno* that Mary was to be honored by means of the rosary for the entire month of October.

We need to be reminded of the *power of the rosary* and the strength of our mother, Mary, so that we take up these beads of protection for ourselves, our families, and our world. Nothing is impossible with God, especially with our blessed mother interceding for us. And for that, thanks be to God! +



A binky is a new, homemade blanket that can be sewn, knitted, crocheted, fleece tied, or quilted and ranges in size from a 3x3 square to a twin-size bed covering. Binky Patrol was founded in 1996 by parishioner Susan Finch as a way to bring

comfort to children in a local battered-women's shelter. It has since blossomed into a nationwide effort of over 160 chapters and 20,000 volunteers to comfort children and teens who are homeless, in foster care, battling chronic and terminal illnesses, or recovering from traumatic events including domestic violence, abuse, and other violent crimes.

Thanks to a grant from the MrBallen Foundation, Binky Patrol is hosting a multi-state Bink-A-Thon - a one-day blanket-making event - on Saturday, October 28th, with one of them happening here at Holy Trinity! Fleece, fabric, and batting for making fleece-tied blankets will be provided, along with coffee, pastries, and fruit. Just bring a pair of sharp scissors and a warm heart! All ages are welcome (there must be at least one adult per four minors) and this does count for community service hours.




