GREETINGS FROM FR. BILL

Thank you to all who participated in last Tuesday's where the grace came. call by Pope Francis and our bishops to pray, fast, and abstain for peace in the Holy Land. The more I learn about the ongoing events, the more distressing it all becomes. I am sure I am not alone in this struggle. Yet, we are in charge of being informed while also protecting our hearts. Our faith does not create a shield of indifference to the horrific plight of the innocent caught in the disturbances in our world. Rather, our faith is informed by the suffering of others and should compel us to act, and not become overwhelmed by fear or hatred.

How? Prayer! Prayer is our first and most important line of help. It is our direct (to God) and indirect (via the intercession of the Saints) appeal to the Holy Trinity to help change things in our world. It brings us closer to God and transforms us when we do it.

It's akin to paying it forward, but the receiver may never know from peace.

Again, thank you all for your faithful efforts. Please continue to pray for peace and consider fasting and abstaining through this difficult time in our world.

AGING WITH GRACE SPECIAL EVENT ON ORGAN, EYE & TISSUE DONATION



Our Aging with Grace ministry is excited to host Dr. Jackie Wirz, Executive Director of Donate Life Northwest, for a special presentation on organ, eye, and tissue donation!

Did you know that the Vatican supports organ donation for all Catholics and considers it a selfless act of compassion? Pope John Paul II affirmed that "a particularly praiseworthy" gesture expressing the culture of life "is the donation of organs. . .offering a chance of health and even of life itself to the sick who sometimes have no other hope" (*Evangelium Vitae*, no. 86).

Organ, eye, and tissue donation are essential parts of modern medicine — in fact, nearly 1 in 20 people will benefit from a tissue donation during their lives — but there is still a lot of misinformation and misunderstanding about the field. Join the conversation on **Friday**, **November 10**th from **1:00-2:30pm** in the **Fireside Room** as Dr. Wirz shares the history of organ donation, how it saves lives, and debunks some of the most common myths.

Since the first century and time of St. Justin, martyr of the early Church, Catholics have been bringing Eucharist to any sick person who was unable to get to Mass. We know that Who we receive is so important, we take the time to bring Him in Holy Eucharist to those unable to get to Mass themselves.

From St. Justin, Martyr:

"And when the president has given thanks, and all the people have expressed their assent, those who are called by us deacons give to each of those present to partake of the bread and wine mixed with water over which the thanksgiving was pronounced, and to those who are absent they carry away a portion."

Last weekend, we had our annual *Homebound Minister Training*, recommissioning our 30 ministers for another year of service to our parish. They bring communion each week to parishioners who are unable to join us at Mass due to age, illness, or injury.

In addition, we serve the two Memory Care Facilities in Beaverton (Brookdale and Waterhouse Ridge) as well as the Senior Living Community, The Springs at Tanasbourne. This pastoral care is available to anyone in need in the parish. We can also assist families to provide this for the members of their family should they wish to provide this service for their loved ones.

Faith Café was started in 2005 by a coalition of Beaverton-area churches, including Holy Trinity, to provide a free, drop-in, hot meal program for people of all ages. Before it opened, there was no

such program operating between Hillsboro and downtown Portland.

Our parish at large and our Filipino Community are two of eight church congregations that rotate responsibility for preparing and servicing a hot meal to anyone who wants it, every Sunday at Bethel Community Church (near the Beaverton City Library). Since its founding, Faith Café has served over 150,000 meals and not one Sunday dinner has been missed — even at the height of the COVID pandemic!



A *binky* is a new, homemade blanket that can be sewn, knitted, crocheted, fleece tied, or quilted and ranges in size from a 3x3 square to a twin-size bed covering. Binky Patrol was founded in 1996 by parishioner Susan Finch as a way to bring comfort to children in a local battered-women's shelter. It has since blossomed into a nationwide effort of over 160 chapters and 20,000 volunteers to comfort children and teens who are homeless, in foster care, battling chronic and terminal illnesses, or recovering from traumatic events including domestic violence, abuse, and other violent crimes.

Thanks to a grant from the MrBallen Foundation, Binky Patrol is hosting a multi-state **Bink-A-Thon** — a one-day blanket-making event — this **Saturday**, **October 28**th, with one of them happening here at Holy Trinity! Fleece, fabric, and batting for making fleece-tied blankets will be provided, along with coffee, pastries, and fruit. Just bring a pair of sharp scissors and a warm heart! All ages are welcome (there must be **at least one adult per four minors**) and this does count for community service hours.




