

Also at the front of the church is the Book of Remembrance for you to include additional names for our prayers during the month. As I mentioned earlier, this Wednesday is All Saints' Day and is a Holy Day of Obligation Opportunity. As such, we'll have Mass at 8:15am, 2:05pm (our School Mass), and 7:00pm. Our 8:15am Mass will be live streamed and the recording available after for those unable to join us in-person.

I'd like to turn now to the Synod on Synodality, which is just concluding its first session (the second will occur next year). Over the last three weeks, I have received numerous questions about what is going on or being said. In general, there is nothing to actually to say about details of what is being shared at the Synod since Pope Francis has called on all members in the Synod to maintain confidentiality. Some social media influencers and outlets have criticized this approach of keeping the details of the discussions in the sessions confidential.

I realize that this may seem somehow undemocratic, but, to be blunt, this is not a democratic process; it is a synodal process, which is, ironically, the focus of the Synod itself. Remember, it is a synod on synodality, where the participants (the Church throughout the world) have been invited to pray, listen, and share their hearts. That means millions have already had their chance to participate at the level which was proper to them (including you and me).

I would be cautious of those who continue to argue as if their voices were not part of the process. This is not a synod on a particular topic, such as the recent Synod on the Amazon or Synod on the Family. My weekend!

vividly remember hearing from parishioners about the Synod on the Amazon as it was happening. When it was all said and done, nothing doctrinal or earth-shattering was concluded. I found it curious that those who were so worried never came back to me sharing that they were thankful that no heresy was declared or that they were mistaken to be so worried. There will always be pundits and those who disagree, but remember: the Holy Spirit is guiding the Church. Her history, given its checkered past of human failures while never erring in doctrine, confirms that truth to me.

So, instead of sharing any commentary, given that I am not involved in the current synodal phase, I recommend reading Bishop Robert Barron's latest article, "A Day at the Synod." Here's an excerpt that stuck out to me:

"The overall mood of the synod I would describe as businesslike and serene. Important and controversial matters are being discussed, and it is very clear that not everyone is of the same opinion, but I have not heard one raised voice or polemical tone. Very occasionally, following an intervention, a smattering of applause might be heard, but typically, each speech is met with a respectful silence."

This still may not be enough for those who are distrustful and demand doctrinal clarity. Remember, the focus of this synod is to learn the process of synodality, whereby the Church reflects by listening and walking with each other. I want to urge us to have no fear, trust the Holy Spirit, and consider reducing or being more aware of one's consumption of the "news" from outside pundits regarding the Synod. I encourage you all to read Bishop Barron's article in full (bit.ly/BishopBarronSynod) as well as a letter written by the participants of the synod (bit.ly/ ParticipantLetterSynod).

Our Aging with Grace ministry is excited to host Dr. Jackie Wirz, Executive Director of Donate Life Northwest, and Tamara Ostervoss, Director of

OHSU's Body Donation Program, for a special presentation on organ, eye, and tissue donation and body donation!

Did you know that the Vatican supports both organ donation and whole body donation for all Catholics and considers it a selfless act of compassion? Pope John Paul II affirmed that "a particularly praiseworthy" gesture expressing the culture of life "is the donation of organs. . .offering a chance of health and even of life itself to the sick who sometimes have no other hope" (Evangelium Vitae, no. 86).

Organ, eye, and tissue donation are essential parts of modern medicine — in fact, nearly 1 in 20 people will benefit from a tissue donation during their lives — but there is still a lot of misinformation and misunderstanding about the field. Join the conversation on **Friday**, **November 10**<sup>th</sup> from **1:00-2:30pm** in the **Fireside Room** as Dr. Wirz shares the history of organ donation, how it saves lives, and debunks some common myths. Ms. Ostervoss will also speak about OHSU's body donation program and the profound significance such a gift has to medical education.

Some things are worth remembering and some traditions are holy in and of themselves. November, for Catholics, is that way. Every November we do the same thing, we remember all who have died. As a parish, we especially remember those whose funeral Mass was done here, and we erect a place where all of our beloved dead can be listed and prayed for.

We count on this tradition. When we suffer a difficult death, this tradition is live giving, especially when consolation is a difficult thing to come by. Seeing my mother's and Mark's father's names on the banners on the altar, hearing their names read, and witnessing the prayers was holy, comforting, and gave us hope.

One November, I will never forget when I heard from one of our parish college teens. It was her first time away from home and she remembered the parish tradition. She called me and asked me to put the name of a young friend of hers who had just died by suicide. She didn't know what else to do, but she remembered our church's tradition. I took his name, promising to pray for her in her sadness, and for him in his. His name is Harley. To this day, I continue to add him to our book, so we can remember him and pray for him as a part of our beloved dead.

This tradition begins this weekend in advance of *All Saints' Day, on November* 1<sup>st</sup>, and *Feast of All Souls, on November* 2<sup>nd</sup>, and continues all month long. *Let us pray:* 

**Prayer for Eternal Rest** (The Requiem Prayer)

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

Faith Café was started in 2005 by a coalition of Beaverton-area churches, including Holy Trinity, to provide a free, drop-in, hot meal program for people of all ages. Before it opened, there was no

such program operating between Hillsboro and downtown Portland.

Our parish at large and our Filipino Community are two of eight church congregations that rotate responsibility for preparing and servicing a hot meal to anyone who wants it, every Sunday at Bethel Community Church (near the Beaverton City Library). 


