SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS COORDINATED BY OUR HOLY TRINITY HEALTH MINISTRY

Our Health Ministry has been hard at work coordinating a series of three seminars to help inform our community about end-of-life (EOL) issues and planning. Taking place between September 2023 and January 2024, each seminar will be held on a **Saturday** in the **Fireside Room** from **9:00-11:00am**.

† ~~September 30th~~ — *Dying, Death & Funerals*

† **November 18th** — *Discussions, Decisions & Documents: Advanced Directives and POLST*

† **January 20th** — *Wills, Finances & Estate Planning*

Our next seminar, *Discussions, Decisions & Documents: Advanced Directives and POLST*, will be led by Donna Routh from our Health Ministry. Discussions with loved ones about the types of medical treatment that we would wish to have at the end of our life are difficult yet

vitaly important. Understanding the different documents and terms can be confusing and stressful. With a focus on the Oregon documents, this seminar will explain what they are, when and for whom they are appropriate, and how they work together to ensure that our wishes are respected if we are unable to speak for ourselves. These discussions and decisions are a gift to our loved ones that can ease their stress, reduce potential conflicts among family members, and provide them with peace of mind. Everyone will be given valuable resource materials to take home.

Light refreshments will be provided, and we hope all will walk away more prepared and confident about EOL issues. No sign-ups necessary, and all ages are welcome! We look forward to seeing you **this Saturday, Nov. 18th** in the **Fireside Room** at **9:00am!**

BRETT'S TWO CENTS

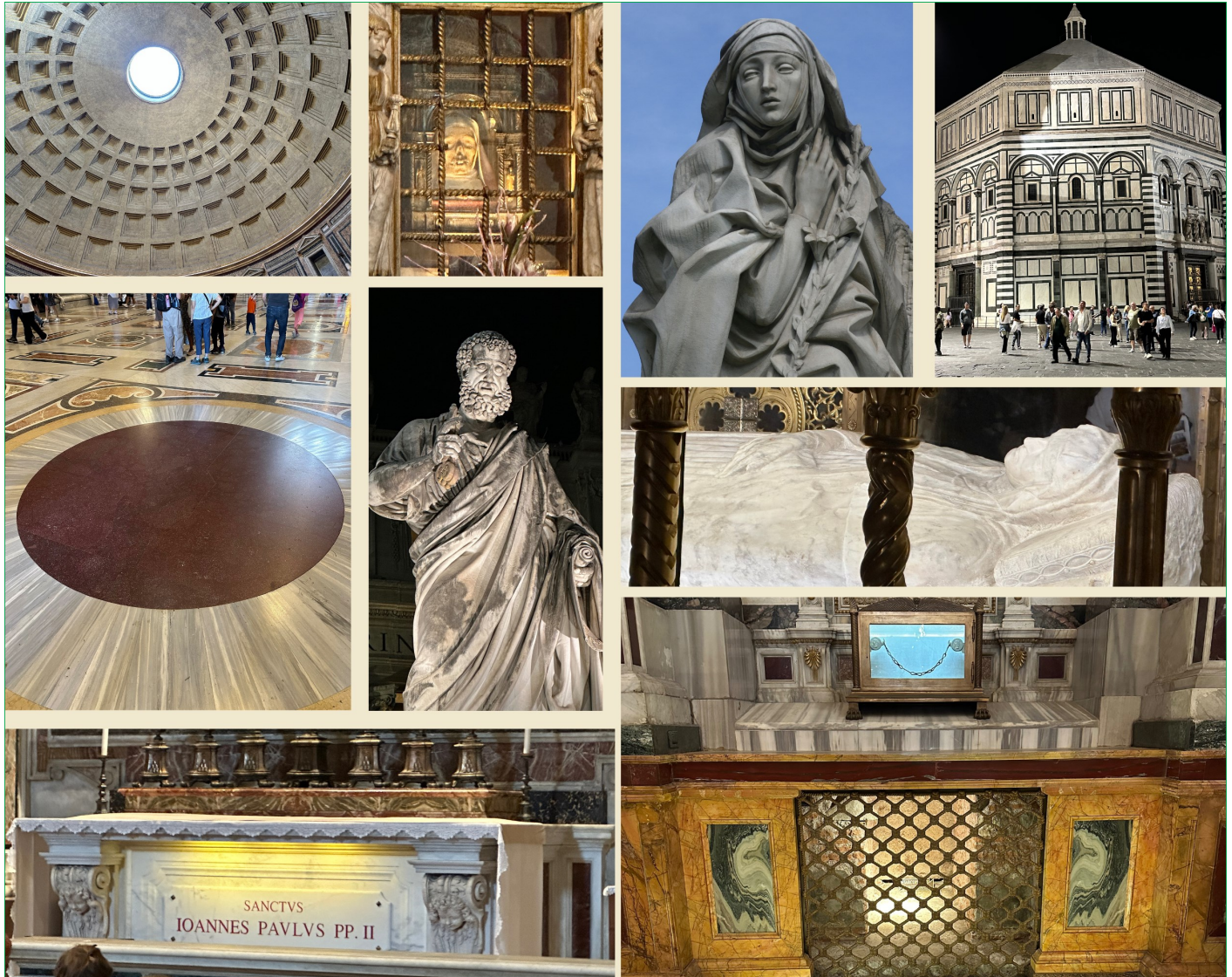
Hello, everyone! If you were here last weekend, you heard me talk a bit about my recent Italy trip with Theresa. Erica thought it would be fun for me to put together some photos for you. Voila! On this page, you can see (starting at the top left and moving right):



1. The famous Bramante staircase that serves as the entrance to the Vatican museums.
2. St. Peter's Square. The obelisk in the middle traditionally marks the spot where Peter was crucified.
3. Tomb of St. Lawrence, St. Stephen, and St. Justin (they're all in the same tomb).
4. Michelangelo's Pieta located in St. Peter's Basilica. Enough said.
5. Sculpture of Laocoon and his two sons in the Vatican Museums. Laocoon was the priest of Neptune that warned the Trojans against bringing the Trojan Horse into their city. He received a gruesome fate for his efforts. Don't interfere with the plans of goddesses!
6. The façade of the Papal Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls (where St. Paul is buried).
7. The central nave of St. Peter's Basilica, with Bernini's famous baldachin over the high altar.
8. The Arch of Trajan, depicting the looting of the Jewish Temple after Jerusalem's destruction in 70 AD.
9. Sculpture of St. Jude in the Basilica of St. John Lateran.
10. The famous dome of Michelangelo in St. Peter's.
11. The tomb of Pope Benedict XVI in the Grottos of St. Peter's; this was originally the spot where JP II was laid to rest.

BRETT'S TWO CENTS

And on this page, you can see (again, starting at the top left and moving right):



1. The 2,000-year-old concrete dome of the Pantheon in Rome. Not a crack after 2,000 years. Pretty impressive engineering!
2. The head of St. Catherine of Siena at the Church of San Damiano in Siena. They have her finger there, as well. Her body is in Rome (see below). Yes, the Europeans are weird.
3. Sculpture of St. Catherine on one of her better days.
4. The Baptistery at the Duomo (Cathedral Church) in Florence where Michelangelo, Dante, Galileo, and Machiavelli (amongst others) were baptized.
5. The disc of porphyry (more valuable than gold!) just inside the main entrance to St. Peter's, marking the spot where Charlemagne was crowned Holy Roman Emperor (and thus the emergence of Europe from the Dark Ages).
6. Sculpture of St. Peter in St. Peter's Square.
7. The tomb of St. Catherine of Siena at Santa Maria Sopra Minerva in Rome, with the rest of her body.
8. The tomb of St. John Paul II in St. Peter's Basilica.
9. The tomb of St. Paul beneath the main altar at St. Paul-Outside-the-Walls. Behind the screen is the actual sarcophagus. Above it, in the blue-lit reliquary, is part of the chain used to hold Paul.

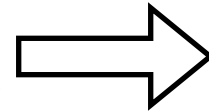
