



In addition, 25% of funds collected remain here in the Archdiocese of Portland to fund local anti-poverty projects.

2022-2023 FISCAL YEAR REVIEW

Hello everyone! Our fiscal year ended on June 30, 2023, and so it's time to update you on the financial state of our parish. Despite several years navigating a pandemic and a volatile economy, Holy Trinity continues to be financially stable — thanks be to God for *you*, our faithful and generous parishioners. Here are the details:

Parish Census & Mass Attendance

From July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023, we had approximately 97 new families join our parish, bringing us to a little over 3,000 families total. Mass attendance averaged 1,791 people per weekend, while daily Mass remained steady at 80–100 attendees. Although Online Mass continued to support many of our parishioners, we were happy to see a lot of our online attendees return to in-person Mass — our average of 539 views per weekend is down from 810 the previous year. Of that, typically 125 watched during the actual live stream, with 30 or so parishioners watching from the parking lot so they could also come up to receive Communion.

Online Presence & Social Media

Our YouTube Channel grew to over 2,100 subscribers, and our Online Mass continued to draw a wide audience, with regular attendees from states like Michigan, New York, and Texas as well as countries like Canada, the U.K., and Australia. The podcast of our homilies was downloaded over 3,600 times by people in over 48 different countries (thanks to Susan Finch for her help!), and our Facebook and Instagram pages grew to nearly 2,000 and 250 followers, respectively.

Staff

We had seven full-time and five part-time staff members who were responsible for worship, pastoral care, faith formation, music, outreach, youth/young adult ministry, sacramental coordination and preparation, facility maintenance, and business operations. After making do for a year without a Parochial Vicar, we were delighted to welcome Fr. Anthony in July.

Sacraments and Faith Formation

28 people participated in our RCIA program and 30+ in our Wednesday Bible Study, while Grow Group went on a temporary hiatus. We had 147 students in our Sunday morning Religious Ed. program, and 15–20 teens in our Youth Ministry program on Sunday afternoons. Our Young Adult Ministry saw over two dozen young adults gather during the week for book studies, faith sharing, basketball, Adoration, and social nights. Several new small faith groups formed during the year, including Aging with Grace, the Legion of Mary, and our Women's Prayer Group. We welcomed 88 people into the Church through baptism (thanks to Dcn. Bob Little for his help!), confirmed 127, prepared 103 for their First Communion, married 8 couples, and celebrated 39 funerals. Our Homebound Ministers faithfully ministered to and stayed connected with 30 parishioners and three local retirement communities through phone and in-person visits.

Food Closet Ministry

We supported 28,344 people suffering from food scarcity and delivered 3,845 backpacks of food to area schools for families in need — a 42% and 19% increase, respectively, from the previous year. 401 local families and veterans were given gift cards for Thanksgiving and Christmas. We also donated to L'Arche Portland and Union Gospel Mission's LifeChange for Women & Children community for their Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners. Our Christmas Toy Drive collected over 700 toys, which were divided between the Beaverton School District, Family Justice Center, and Oregon Department of Health & Human Services. We also gave \$19,233 to individuals needing help with gas, rent, and various other emergency needs. Perhaps most exciting was the creation of our Food Closet Garden, which was completed and had its first bounty harvested in June. All of this was made possible by your generous donations to our Food Closet Ministry!

Facilities & Property

Overall, our facilities remained in good shape for the fiscal year, but the summer heat put the church's HVAC system to the test. While it is now back in working order, most of the units that service our church and school are 20+ years of age. As such, we're making contingency plans for stages of replacements in the not-too-distant future. In preparation for Fr. Anthony's arrival, improvements were made to the Parochial Vicar's house (mostly with interior paint, carpeting, and furniture). Similar improvements were also made to the Pastor's house and to the Parish Office over the course of the year. At the end of June, installation work

began on a campus-wide security camera system as an additional safety measure for parishioners, students, and staff. We were also notified that the county has indefinitely halted its plans for widening Walker Road east of Murray Boulevard due to financial constraints and increased costs.

Income, Expenses, and Savings

Our parish averaged about \$23,766 in weekly offertory donations. Electronic donations continued to ensure a steady cash flow, with about 300 families having checks sent to us automatically from their banks or charitable giving funds and another 700 or so donating through our parish website. We averaged \$729 in loose cash in our weekly collection basket, while 400 families donated using offertory envelopes. With the re-established in-pew collection, we've seen this already generous giving increase.


We donated \$100,000 between three key organizations and ministries with which we work:

Seminarian Appeal - \$50,000

CYO/Camp Howard - \$30,000

Beaverton Resource Center - \$20,000

To maintain financial stability, we have \$3.1 million in the Archdiocesan-managed Parish Funds Trust.

School

Holy Trinity School is one of our key parish ministries. To support our students and the work of our faculty, we contributed \$271,000 as a required and capped subsidy by the Archdiocese, or about \$5,200 per week.

Archdiocesan Relationship

As a parish in the Archdiocese of Portland, we receive services such as HR assistance, investment management, real estate expertise and consulting, seminarian education (which includes our own Deacon Justin Echevarria and Deacon James Ladd), and staffing assistance (like Fr. Anthony's assignment here). In turn, we were assessed 8% (approximately \$101,816) of our offertory collected in fiscal year 2020–2021.

Summary

The economy seems to have leveled out a bit, but still remains on rocky ground. Our financials continue to be moderately healthy. We want you to know how grateful we are for the continuing faith and trust you place in us as your local parish. Your generosity allows us not only to provide Mass, the Sacraments, education, and counseling to our fellow parishioners, but also vital material, social, and spiritual support to those in need in our community. Above all, Holy Trinity thrives because of the many parishioners who generously contribute their time and talent to our three advisory councils and 30+ community groups and ministries, including our School and Food Closet. Each of you, our faithful parishioners, continue to *make a difference*!
