#### Religious Education

I find myself constantly feeling both grateful and humbled for the people in this ministry. The way the children express their faith and enter so sincerely into moments of prayer

sometimes catches me by surprise!

One Sunday morning, a very small child (about six years old) told me he would like to pray for his dog that had just passed away, and as we prayed together his little frown turned into a big smile. He was experiencing the joy of prayer in a way I don't always do myself, and it reminded me that Jesus commanded his disciples (including us!) to become more like children themselves.

Even more, I'm amazed by the generosity of our volunteer team. Each one of them brings their unique mix of strengths and talents to the children they lead. Miss Beth always has some fun art projects for her kindergartners, and Neela is especially good at helping the children to enter into prayer and ritual. Heather leads our 2nd grade group with creativity and patience, backed up by her son, Jake, and her mother, Lorna. Corrie, Peter, Sofia and Lydia have a curious way of making Church teachings interesting and even exciting to our 5th and 6th grade students.

It's my privilege to observe them each create the kind of friendships, trust, and shared experience that root our young generation strongly in their faith. They don't hear it often enough, but I'm grateful for and inspired by them every Sunday!

#### Confirmation

Because Confirmation is a sacrament of going out into the world to serve and evangelize others, we don't always get to enjoy the fruits of the work that goes into preparing young people for it. I was recently at one of our local grocery stores when a young woman approached me right there in the produce section. She was one of our Confirmation candidates from a few years back, and we hadn't seen each other in quite some time. "I didn't really get what you were saying when I took the classes," she told me, "but now that I'm out here in the real world it totally makes sense!"

It warms my heart to encounter our young Catholics after their Confirmation. I see Colby greeting people at the door of the church on Sunday mornings, and Cameron and Dominic volunteering together at our Food Closet. Preethi is both a greeter and a lector at our 9:30am Mass, and Jocelyn is singing in the choir.

Many others are serving in ways that the parish community can't see: Paige began leading retreats for other high school students, and Lorelei started a high school rosary club. The list goes on!

Our teens aren't disappearing. They're living their faith all over the place! I'm so thankful for their presence in our community and their witness to the world. We see some here at the parish all the time, but I'm inspired by those chance encounters that show me how others put their faith into action elsewhere — on the football field, in their schools, and even at the produce department.

Some highlights from 2023 at your Food Closet Ministry (*stats as of 12/22*):

- ★ More than 26,550 adults and children served through this Ministry; this is the equivalent of feeding the city of Tualatin or West Linn!
- ★ More than 27,160 pounds of donations; that's equal to 13.5 tons, 14 Liberty Bells, or 8 cars!
- ★ Permanent roof extension built, protecting our clients and volunteers every day.
- ★ Moved, cleaned, and rebuilt a greenhouse, so fresh vegetables can still be grown and provided to our clients during the winter.
- ★ In its first season, we harvested over 980 lbs. of produce from the "Michelle's Legacy" Food Closet Garden!

Every day, I am inspired by the epic generosity of our parish and the countless individuals who donate to the Food Closet. I am inspired by the multi-talented and multi-capable volunteers, who truly epitomize "service before self." I am inspired by the resilience of our clients, who exhibit kindness and thankfulness even in challenging times. And I am inspired by our **great Holy Trinity Staff**, who face every challenge with compassion and grace!

With the variety of ministries I am a part of (RCIA, Adult Sacraments, Homebound Ministry, Annulment Facilitation, Altar Servers, and our online Prayer Ministry), at the root of them are people, the amazing volunteers who generously serve, and those who these ministries benefit.

We have a *team of 11 for RCIA* who come every Tuesday night, September to post-Easter, to guide our new Catholics and the adults completing their sacraments. We have 25 *Homebound Ministers* who bring Jesus in the Eucharist to our Homebound every week. There are 60+ "pray-ers" in our *Prayer Ministry* (anyone can do this — sign-up at <a href="https://prayer-ministry">h-t.org/prayer-ministry</a>!), who pray for the intentions submitted online, that fellow members send out, and that I receive calls and emails about from our parish family. We have 75 *Altar Servers* and their generous parents who make sure their children are available to serve the community. These are only part of the good work our Parish does, week in and week out.

The Church is alive and well at Holy Trinity! In the last 15 years, I have been blessed to be part of a variety of ministerial work for the parish. More than that, Mark and I have called HT our parish home since we came to Oregon in 2004. And for all of this: *Thanks be to God!* +
