GREETINGS FROM FR. BILL

First, I have a gentle request/reminder that has been passed on to me – please go easy on perfume or cologne use when coming to church. There are those who are quite allergic and when we are in tight quarters it can be very uncomfortable/overpowering, especially as the number of folks attending Mass in-person continues to increase again. Thank you!

Our Lenten Reconciliation Service will be **this Saturday, March 11th at 10:00am** in the **Church**. After a short Liturgy of the Word and reflection, we will have nine priests available to offer this healing sacrament. We had about 400 people join us for our Advent service, and we're expecting (hoping!) for at least that many this time. Join us!

On the subject of confession, I'm adjusting our **regularly scheduled Saturday confession time to 3:30-5:00pm**, adding the additional half-hour starting this Saturday, March 11th. This change will continue **just for the season of Lent** – so, just the next four Saturdays (March 11, 18 & 25 and April 1). The Friday confession time remains as-is, from about 8:45-9:30am (after daily Mass).

I haven't decided yet if there will be scheduled time for confessions on Good Friday, but there will be no scheduled time for confessions on Easter Vigil.

On the subject of Good Friday and Easter Vigil, I want to confirm our schedule of Triduum and Easter services for you, which all take place in the Church:

- Holy Thursday** – 7:00pm
- Good Friday** – Passion Play at 9:00am
(by HT School's 8th gr. class)
Stations at 3:00pm
Liturgy at 7:00pm
- Easter Vigil** – 7:00pm
- Easter Sunday** – 8:00, 9:30 & 11:15am

All three of our Triduum liturgies and our 9:30am Easter Sunday Mass will be live streamed. We anticipate being able to provide Communion outside for those who wish to attend our evening Triduum services by streaming in the parking lot, as it shouldn't be too dark out with Daylight Saving Time in effect (which is next Sunday, by the way).

Funeral services were held last week for Bryan Spooner (*we sincerely apologize for misspelling his name in last week's e-News*). Services are scheduled for Nina Gascon on Friday, March 10th at 11:30am and for Lena Frost on Friday, March 17th at 1:00pm. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace.

It offers opportunities for your family to engage daily with the spiritual pillars of Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. - ✠ **Meatless Meals.** Each year, we abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays during Lent. This year, challenge yourself to add an additional meat-free day each week, or even eat plant-based meals throughout the season. - ✠ **Supper & Stations.** Each Friday during Lent, different parish groups will provide a simple soup supper with bread/crackers (*though the gesture is appreciated, please do not bring additional bread or goodies to share!*) and lead us in Stations of the Cross. Supper starts at 6:00pm in Fireside; Stations start at 7:00pm in the church.
- ✠ **Outdoor Stations of the Cross.** Don't forget, we have an outdoor set of stations available for you 24/7 as well! It is a 300-yard loop in the far corner of our parking lot across from the Food Closet. You'll go clockwise starting at the lamppost and make a loop around the grassy area.

FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH: THOUGHTS ON FAITH

There's a bad joke that says the church could make their annual income if they charged money on Ash Wednesday! We need Lent, witnessed by how many come to receive ashes. We step down off our personal pedestals, recognizing that we had no reason to be standing on them in the first place, and we acknowledge for everyone to see, that we are sinners. More importantly, we acknowledge that for ourselves. We pick up and hold on to the hope that this Lent it will be different, and we set off with the three things that Jesus himself gave us as our tools for transformation.

Jesus said, *"When you pray, when you fast, when you give alms,"* assuming that we all will actually **DO** these 3 things. Isn't it just like Jesus to make it easy for us to remember what to do? He did this with the 10 commandments for us as well, summarizing them into just two: *"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first*

commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mt 22:37-39). He reminds us that it is all about how we treat God and how we treat our fellow human beings, which encompasses the other eight commandments.

As baptized Catholics, along with those preparing to complete their sacraments at Easter, we are all called to do these things. We also need to recognize that it's difficult to sustain. Left to our own devices, we move on to other priorities. This time, ask God to help us to finish what we have begun. Even better, to continue to do these things once Lent is over. After all, isn't this what being a practicing Catholic all about? That's why it's called *"practicing"*: doing it until we get it right, and at the heart of it, being closer to Jesus!

May the practices of Lent help us to become better followers of Jesus and in leading and sustaining a Catholic life. +

The Second Sunday of Lent: Sit, Do Nothing, and Be Transformed

REFLECT: [Today's] Genesis reading considers the call of Abram: a call to radical change, to leave everything he knew and go to another place that God would show him. God promised that Abram would be a blessing to those with whom he came into contact. Psalm 121 promises that God will be with us day and night.

In Romans, Paul encourages us to see that God blesses us as we work, and even if we are doing nothing, because we believe in God's transforming love that creates and recreates and makes possible what we may think impossible. [In the Gospel], Jesus took Peter, James and John up to a mountain, and before their very own eyes they saw his Essence. They saw his connection to the past, the present with them, and his future mission.

ASK: Where do we see signs of transfiguration? Do we believe as Abram did that God is blessing others through us, day and night?

PRAY: Father, as I hear your call for change, allow it to energize my life, transforming me and drawing me ever closer to you.

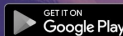
