It is a surprisingly quiet and peaceful 300-yard loop in the far corner of our parking lot across from the Food Closet. You'll go clockwise starting at the lamppost and make a loop around the grassy area.

FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH: THOUGHTS ON FAITH

All sin is deadly, but there are *seven of them that scripture points to* in particular. In our modern sensibilities, we might not even know what they are, but they have been around for centuries in the Church. The first mention of them was by a 4th century monk named *Evagrius of Pontus*, who identified and wrote about "*eight of the vilest sins*" to avoid and resist. Two centuries later in **600 AD**, *Pope Gregory I* refined the list, and to this day we have his list of *seven deadly sins*. We need to know what they are: *Lust, Gluttony, Greed, Sloth, Wrath (anger), Envy, and Pride*.

Where do we find these? In the Bible, of course, and they are identified and pointed out so we can avoid them. Why? Weren't you reading – because they are **DEADLY**, they kill our souls! These keep us from growing spiritually and harm our relationship with God. How do we fix it? Aside from Confession, which forgives the sin, we can employ the *Seven Heavenly Virtues* to overcome the sins themselves. Don't know what these virtues are? It's probably good that we learn them! *Humility* poisons pride, *chastity* defangs lust, *temperance* bridles gluttony, *charity* overpowers greed, *fortitude* overcomes sloth, *prudence* outlasts envy, and *patience* conquers anger (wrath).

There is a reason the Bible give us all of these, both sins and virtues, the bad and the good. *It is to identify the sinful enemies we have and the heavenly tools we have been given to overcome them.* This puts us into right relationship with Jesus, and Jesus is always the ultimate answer to our salvation.

As St. Paul says in Romans 6:23, "*For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.*" Amen! +

**The Third Sunday of Lent:
Woman at the Well**

REFLECT: We know little about the woman who met Jesus at the well in a small Samaritan town in the heat of the day. We know that she has had five husbands and that the man she is with at this time is not her husband. . . [S]he knows her history and the meaning of being a Samaritan in the presence of a Jew. Yet, she is drawn into Jesus' kindness and respect; she listens. This man is not like the others, he sees her as a person, he knows her, and does not reject her life story. He wants to talk with her. . . As they talked, his words stirred her very being. There is something wonderful about him, he speaks truth. He raises her up with unconditional love.

ASK: The cleansing water of baptism has washed over us. Yet we know that, like the woman at the well, we are sinners too and desire transformation of our hearts and relationships. Have I spent time this Lent reflecting and seeking forgiveness and rejoicing in God's unconditional love?

PRAY: Father, you know me and you love me. Help me to find forgiveness in your loving embrace.
