As you may have read or seen in the news, there were some instabilities in the banking industry this past week. This included our own bank, First Republic Bank. When we learned of this last Saturday, Dcn. Brett and I immediately sought out advice from our Administrative Council. The result was to move more of our funds to the Archdiocesan Parish Funds

Our goal with these decisions is to balance out the overall funds of Holy Trinity - Parish, Food Closet, and School - to reduce exposure over the FDIC insurance limit of \$250,000 per customer, per institution. While this will make our accounting more complicated, it will give us more security with the funds that you have so generously donated. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to talk to me, Dcn. Brett, or any of our Admin. Council members.

Funeral services were held last week for Lena Frost and Phyllis Gunther (Franz). We are also saddened to note the death of parishioner Robert Gauna, whose funeral Mass will be held down in California. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace.

Reflections for Lent 2023 from the Sisters of the Holy Cross

The Fourth Sunday of Lent: "...I am the light of the world."

REFLECT: [This Gospel message] reveals the struggles we face between good and bad, power powerlessness, poor and rich, believers non-believers, upper class and lower class, upper caste and lower caste, literate and illiterate, professional and amateur, justice and injustice, immigrants inhabitants, inclusivism and racism, prejudice and fairness, blindness and openness, sinfulness and darkness holiness, and light, dominant and non-dominant, minority and majority. These are the categories made in the societies where we live.

The Pharisees, who have privilege, status, and respect in the society, especially in the practice of faith, had the most difficulty accepting Jesus, his words and his actions. . . One may fall in darkness unknowingly (unknowingly in the eyes of human judgment), but as soon as that person acknowledges and wants to return to the light, God is overjoyed. . . So, it is...mandated by the call of God, to come out from our darkness, remove the scales from our eyes, throw away our blindfolds, and live in the Light of Jesus, who shows the way, the truth.

ASK: Am I afraid of my darkness? Am I able to touch and acknowledge it? Am I ready to take the scales from my eyes and to be a person of light?

PRAY: Father, open my eyes to the darkness around me and allow your light to shine through me to illuminate this darkness.




