NOTES FROM NICK

Hello, there! As we approach the end of Lent, I wanted parking lot, which follow the "traditional" series of to take a moment to answer some questions that many of you have asked about our Friday evening Stations of the Cross — the history of this practice, why we do it, and how you can participate.

The Stations of the Cross are an ancient Catholic practice that invite us to walk alongside Jesus' journey from his condemnation to his crucifixion and death. It originated in Jerusalem as a way for our earliest Christian brothers and sisters to walk the actual path that Jesus walked as He approached His crucifixion.

The events that took place during the final hours of Jesus' life occurred along a path that was about a mile long, which came to be known as the Via Dolorosa (the Way of Sorrows). In the 15th century, Franciscan monks had the idea to recreate the Stations of the Cross in Europe to make the practice more accessible for European Catholics and, by extension, Catholics everywhere who found it difficult to make a pilgrimage to the Holy Land.

Today, the Stations of the Cross are celebrated by Christians everywhere, especially during Lent. In nearly every Catholic church in the world, one can find each of the 14 Stations represented by a cross, a painting, or a statue either within the church or on church grounds.

Here at Holy Trinity, we have two sets of Stations: the murals within the church, which follow the Scriptural Stations that Pope John Paul II popularized, and the outdoor stations located in the northwest corner of the

Stations.

Our Lenten tradition is for a different ministry group to lead parishioners through the Stations at 7:00pm in the Church every Friday during Lent, after hosting a 6:00pm Soup Supper in the Fireside Room. We also have a variety of Stations you can pray with and reflect on at home available on our website, at **h-t.org/lent-stations**.

During the service, you are invited to join in prayer and reflection, meditating on the events of Jesus' journey and the significance of his sacrifice. It is a solemn and reflective practice that can help deepen your faith and understanding of the Christian message: Jesus dying to save each of us from our sins so that we might become sons and daughters of God.

This Friday, March 31st, will be final evening for Soup Supper and Stations of the Cross for this year's Lenten season. On Good Friday (April 7th), Fr. Bill will lead us in the Stations at 2:00pm in the Church.

The Stations of the Cross are a powerful tradition that has been celebrated for centuries. By participating in this practice, we can deepen our relationship with Jesus and reflect on His sacrifice for each of us. Whether you attend a service here at Holy Trinity or simply take some time to reflect on the Stations at home, may the Stations of the Cross bring you closer to God and deepen your faith as we finish our journey through this Lenten season toward Easter!

FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH: THOUGHTS ON FAITH

To scrutinize means to examine or look closely at for judging quality or condition. And isn't that part of what we do in Lent? Knowing ourselves as sinners, we use Lent to consider and take measure of ourselves. We then hand over to Jesus the things that need to be healed and transformed, and discard the things that have harmed us and gotten in God's way.

Part of the *paradox* of Lent is how we do this inner probing. Remember our 3 Lenten tools (pray, fast, give alms)? By turning our attention away from ourselves, we begin to get a clearer picture of what a rightly-ordered life looks like. With prayer, we have tried to turn our attention towards God, who is our greatest good. Nothing compares with Him. With our fasts, we eliminated some of what takes our attention away from God, giving room for the things that only God can give us. Almsgiving demanded we use for others what we normally use for ourselves. Through this we see an altered and better place for ourselves in the scheme of importance of rightlyordered priorities. For me, even this isn't enough, but thanks be to God, it's a start!

At our 9:30am Mass this weekend we will be praying a Scrutiny, one of the Rites of the RCIA with our soon-to-be new Catholics. Using the Litany of Liberation, all present will prayerfully consider themselves against this sinful accounting. I put it here so we can all pray it with them.

Lord Jesus, we ask you to free us from everything that keeps our surrender to you from being complete.

Reflections for Lent 2023 from the Sisters of the Holy Cross (full reflections available at <u>h-t.org/lent</u>)

The Fifth Sunday of Lent:
"I have said this for the sake of the crowd, that they may believe."

REFLECT: The Gospel reading for today is the last of the signs in John's Gospel, and it occurs right before the passion and resurrection of Jesus. In all of Jesus' interactions leading up to the raising of Lazarus, he is encouraging and explicitly calling on his disciples Martha and Mary to believe. All his conversations with them and his actions call forth deeper faith that he is the "resurrection and the life." It calls forth Martha's declaration of faith, "Yes, Lord, I believe you are the Messiah" . . .

Jesus is working hard to make sure we have a way to believe; he wants us to believe. He knows that faith in a loving God can be very difficult in dark times. . . . We live in dark and confusing times. We sometimes wonder where our God is. Somehow, when it is darkest, Jesus sends us a sign .

ASK: How am I being called to faith and new life in these dark times? What signs of faith and hope do I experience amid the darkness of our world?

PRAY: Father, despite the darkness surrounding us in these times, you are the light always within us and around us. Help me to see your shining light this week.




