GREETINGS FROM FR. BILL

This weekend, we ritually celebrate the Passion and death of the Lord at Mass. Yes, I do mean *celebrate*! We celebrate it because we know where it leads. Palm Sunday is an opportunity to more fully realize what Christ went through to save us from our sins, and moreover, how that passion and death lead to his glorious Resurrection.

Recall Dcn. Brett's homily last week when he shared about how anxiety and suffering happens to us all. Sometimes, God intercedes quickly, while other times we are left waiting. The Good News is that our waiting is not done in vain, but in hope and faith. Jesus knows our pains and sufferings, and it is only through the Cross that true resurrection and joy can be received. Thank you, Jesus, for loving us unto death.

This Holy Week, consider inviting a friend who hasn't been to Mass in awhile to join you at one (or more) of our liturgies. You could plan to meet them at church and sit together, or consider picking them up and driving them to church as well.

When you are present, be mindful that we will be hosting many people who have been away, are visiting, or are present for the first time. Arriving early helps ensure a good seat, but please avoid saving seats, as it can be really off-putting to our many visitors. Make an effort to introduce yourself, welcome them if they're visiting, and don't kick them

out if they're sitting in "your" pew/seat (ha!). Simply be the wonderful, generous parishioners that you are, mindful that joy begets more joy!

I hope to see you at all the amazing celebrations this Holy Week, including the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral (see below in "Holy Week Resources & Opportunities" for details) and especially at our own celebration of the Triduum and Easter Sunday here at Holy Trinity. As a reminder, here's our schedule:

✠ **Holy Thursday (4/6) – 7:00pm** (live streamed)

Note: NO morning Mass or usual Holy Hour.

✠ **Good Friday (4/7) – 7:00pm** (live streamed)

Note: NO morning Mass, Confession times, or First Friday Adoration.

✠ **Easter Vigil (4/8) – 7:00pm** (live streamed)

Note: NO First Saturday Adoration & Mass, afternoon Confession time, or usual 5:30pm Mass.

✠ **Easter Sunday (4/9) – 8:00am, 9:30am** (live streamed), and 11:15am

Come home for Easter! Let us celebrate together the greatest rescue ever carried out: the rescue from the powers of sin and death which has since offered us to eternal life. Thank you, Jesus!

HOLY WEEK RESOURCES & OPPORTUNITIES

✠ **Chrism Mass.** All are invited to attend this year's Chrism Mass on **Monday, April 3rd at 7:00pm at St. Mary's Cathedral** (1716 NW Davis St., Portland). Priests from across the Archdiocese will gather to concelebrate with Archbishop Sample as he consecrates the sacred Chrism and blesses the Oil of the catechumens and the Oil of the sick. These Holy Oils will then be distributed to all parishes and used throughout the year for their respective sacramental purpose.

✠ **Adoration at the Altar of Repose.** Instead of the usual dismissal after Communion on **Holy Thursday**, we do the ancient and very moving rite of the Transfer of the Most Blessed Sacrament. After being carried in solemn procession through the church, the Blessed Sacrament is placed on the Altar of Repose – this will be our primary altar in the church, rather than the one in the chapel – before all depart in silence. The Church will remain open until **10:00pm** for you to spend time in prayer with our Eucharistic Lord.

✠ **Passion Play.** Presented by HT School's 8th grade class at **9:00am** in the Church on **Good Friday**.

✠ **Stations of the Cross.** Led by Fr. Bill at **2:00pm** in the Church on **Good Friday**.

FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH: THOUGHTS ON FAITH

We are in the middle of what the Church used to call the *Passiontide*. These are the *two weeks* that begin with the *5th Sunday of Lent*, and the *2nd Sunday of the Passiontide* that we now call *Palm* or *Passion Sunday*. Confused? Don't be. It's no longer a separate liturgical season, but what we celebrate is the same.

During these final days before Easter, we pay heightened attention to the *sufferings and death of Jesus*. In case our Lent has become more about what we have given up than what Jesus gave up for us, it's a time for us to rectify that.

No one has shown us better the value of suffering, than Jesus Himself. It's the reason that Jesus came. Take a deep breath and let that sink in. From the day of His birth to Good Friday, *everything was leading to the cross*. Read the Gospels!

"And he [Jesus] began to teach them that the Son of man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. And he said this plainly."
Mark 8:31-32

Jesus mentions it repeatedly, and the disciples (*and you and me*) don't seem to hear Him. In our deafness, we miss something crucial, the beautiful example of the *suffering servant*, our Jesus who, in that one week, enters Jerusalem in Triumph on Sunday, is betrayed on Wednesday, arrested on Thursday night after celebrating the Passover, and is crucified and dies on Friday.

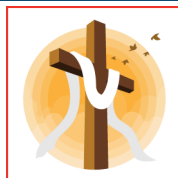
Thanks be to God that we know how the story ends. (So did His disciples, but it didn't help them to believe.) This Holy Week, let's join Jesus in what he has suffered for us. Let us read the *Passion narratives* in the Gospels. Let's live this last week *hungry*, without some of the comforts that shield us from the cruelty of this world. We anchor our sacrifices to the *One Sacrifice of Jesus*.

May we enter the tomb with Jesus on Good Friday, anticipating and grateful for the joy of Easter! +

Palm Sunday

REFLECT: Isaiah has prepared us for our mission in spreading God's word. . . He encourages us to follow his example and do as he has done. "I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame."

[Speaking] to the Philippians. . . [Paul] urges them to purge the enmity from their hearts and prepare their souls for God's gift of peace and love. Accepting God's love in our hearts is all we will need on our journey.

With all the preparation above, Matthew takes us to the Last Supper and the crucifixion of Jesus. "Tonight your faith in me will be shaken, as Scripture has it: 'I will strike the shepherd and the sheep of the flock will be dispersed.'" And then all the pain and sorrow that we know so well follows.

ASK: How is God preparing me physically to spread his word to others? How does God use us to prepare others to accept his gifts of love, peace and gratitude? Reread the Gospel and take a moment to see yourself in a few of these people: Mary, Judas, Pilate, Simon. Try to touch their feelings at the death of our Lord.

PRAY: Father, I put my trust in you. Take care of everything.
