GREETINGS FROM FR. BILL

This weekend, we hear the story about the disciples who were leaving Jerusalem to Emmaus. From the context of their conversation, they were saddened by Jesus' death and their difficulty at believing that he had arisen, as was reported to them.

Sadness and distress happens when we lose those closest to us. This Saturday, April 22nd, is the 28th anniversary of my father's passing. If you have ever lost a parent, you know the sadness that can follow. It is a solemn day for me to offer Mass, but I have faith in the Resurrection of Christ and the mercy of God which give me hope to be reunited with my dad someday. Like the disciples, I have encountered the Risen Christ in the "breaking of the bread" at Mass in my own personal life.

It is my deepest desire that we all encounter Christ in a powerful, transformative, and ongoing way. If you are wandering in your faith or feel abandoned or saddened by some great loss in your life, please seek

out the Lord of all Hope and Joy. Ask Jesus to open your heart and show you how much he loves you. Ask him to show you the path of life (*cf. Psalm 16 Response for today's Mass*) he has called you to live. May this Easter season bring you opportunities for this renewal of your hope and joy!

On Saturday, May 20th, one of our Holy Trinity seminarians, James Ladd, will be ordained to the diaconate by Archbishop Sample! All are invited to attend this special event, which will take place at St. Mary's Cathedral (1716 NW Davis St.) at 11:00am, with a reception following. Just two classes left until our R.E. program goes “into the tomb” for the summer! If you are interested in celebrating one of the sacraments with your child in the next school year, here’s what you need to know:

1. Children **under the age of 7** can be Baptized year-round (*except during Lent*); visit h-t.org/baptism or email Pat (pat@h-t.org) for details.
2. R.E. classes for Kindergarten-5th grade (and Baptism classes for ages 7+) will begin in September. Registration will open in the summer. Priority is given to families who are already registered and actively participating in HT parish life.
3. The #1 best thing a family can do to help their child prepare for any sacrament is to come to Mass together. Young people who are familiar with the Mass have less anxiety when it comes time to participate in Masses of First Communion, Confirmation, etc.

FOR WHAT IT’S WORTH: THOUGHTS ON FAITH

“Easter is over, so now what?” Do you ever feel like this? We just finished **40 days of Lent** which was designed to redirect our lives in a **Christ-centered direction**, and then we celebrated the magnificence of Easter and Christ’s resurrection from the dead! Wow! Like our new Catholics who were baptized at the Easter Vigil, Easter demands our **conversion**! Something has changed and our lives must show it. We can’t just go back to our old ways!

In essence, from our newly baptized to you and me, we do as Christ as commanded us to do: *“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit” (Mt 28:19)*. And although baptism is not our job, a sharing of the Good News is!

Day 173 of Flocknote’s “Catechism in a Year” series (flocknote.com/catechism) summarizes this well: *“Christians must, therefore, proclaim to everyone the Good News borne by Christ; and following His path, they must be ready for self-sacrifice even unto martyrdom” (CCC 852-856)*. Let’s look closer at that.

First: *“Christians must, therefore, proclaim to everyone the Good News borne by Christ”*. We must share what we have come to know and believe and proclaim it boldly, sometimes using words, always using the testimony of our changed lives. We must be clear and visible followers of Jesus. That is the beautiful fruit that comes from our faith, a life giving transformation of our lives. By the grace of God, we’ve discarded our old ways, and we testify by that change that something now is different.

Second: *“and following His path, they must be ready for self-sacrifice even unto martyrdom”*. Thankfully, most of us will not be called to make that ultimate sacrifice for our faith, but rather, we give of ourselves in small and consistent daily ways that deepen our faith and allow us to share it with others. That is our **baptismal call** and it is Jesus who helps us to live this. It can be as simple as a daily ‘yes’ to what God is asking us to be.

It’s God our Savior, in the person of Jesus, *“who desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth” (1 Tm 2:4)*. Our part of that is to share what we believe with others so that all may know the truth and find salvation in Jesus.

With God’s grace, may we be bold in sharing and generous in our sacrifice and giving, so that what we have come to believe in Christ Jesus our Lord takes deeper root in ourselves and passes on to others. Amen!

The Third Sunday of Easter: From Giving Up to Going On

REFLECT: Give up or keep going? The disciples on the road to Emmaus had had enough. They decided to give up and go back to their former lives. But an unexpected encounter with a stranger reminded them that especially in our darkest moments of despair, God remains to heal the hurt and restore hope. Recognizing the risen Jesus through sharing stories and breaking bread, they return to the community filled with joy and excitement.

As missionary disciples, we may lose hope and be tempted to give up. However, in challenging ourselves to leave our comfort zone and be open to encounters with strangers, we meet the risen Lord who empowers us to keep going on and to share our joy with others.

ASK & RESPOND: How is the Spirit inviting you to give a second look to individuals or areas/issues you may have given up on? Climate change is one of those areas that can easily overwhelm us. In honor of Earth Day, list three things you can begin to do this week to help heal our common home.
