GREETINGS FROM FR. BILL

This weekend, we return to the readings of Ordinary Time. While the last three weeks have technically been in Ordinary Time, the included weekends were spiced up by special feasts and solemnities: Pentecost, Holy Trinity, and Corpus Christi. Now we're in it for the long haul until November!

These days and weeks are considered "ordinary" not because they are plain, but because they are numbered — in Latin, ordinalis. This is when we hear the stories of Christ's life after his childhood and just before his death and Resurrection. The USCCB website describes it as "a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ." Of course, there is nothing common, plain, or unremarkable about Christ's life. But the Church desires that the coming days and weeks be a time of deeper reflection on the events of Jesus'

life so that we will be spiritually fed by his teachings and miracles.



Do we Catholics know that the entire month of June is devoted to the *Sacred Heart of Jesus*? Surprised? Maybe because we don't know enough about this devotion. It's been around since the 11th century, and our great Saints and faithful Catholics have carried it forward to today.

The *Sacred Heart* is who Jesus is. Consider its depicted image: A pierced heart, consumed by the fire of Jesus's love for us. Topped by the cross He endured for you and me, the heart is wrapped in thorns, like those in the crown he wore for us. Jesus' love for us deserves that we learn what this devotion is and claim it as our own; check out bit.ly/SacredHeart-EWTN.

Want to begin a devotion of your own? One way is to begin a daily offering to Jesus's Sacred Heart:
