GREETINGS FROM FR. BILL

Next weekend you will be meeting Fr. Anthony Hoangphan (pronounced wong-fan), our newly ordained Parochial Vicar! He concelebrating all four Masses with me for his first weekend and you'll have a chance to meet him afterwards on the porch. We have been eagerly awaiting his arrival and I know a lot of you have been praying for him. Please keep the prayers coming; all of us doing ministry need them big time! I look forward to sharing the pastoral care of our parish with Fr. Anthony and am eager to introduce him to this wonderful parish. We will be collaborating closely, along with the rest of the staff, and I know he will be a great addition to our team.

Here's a basic schedule we will be following — all subject to change due to the many things that come up in parish life!

Office Hours: I will continue to take Mondays and Tuesday mornings off; Fr. Anthony will be away on Thursday afternoons and Fridays. At this time, Fr. Anthony will be managing his calendar personally.

Weekend Masses: Fr. Anthony and I will rotate weekends with Dcn. Brett in a similar fashion to how he, Fr. Dave, and Fr. Hans/Fr. Tony did in past years. All three of us plan to be present at all Masses, except when on vacation or sick.

Daily Masses: Fr. Anthony will regularly preside at Monday and Tuesday Masses; I will regularly preside on Thursdays and Fridays. We will alternate on Wednesdays (including for School Mass when that resumes in the fall).

Confessions: Normally, the one who will be presiding/preaching at the Masses will *not* be

hearing the Saturday afternoon confessions, but may come by for the last 15 minutes to help make sure that all penitents have had the chance to experience the Sacrament. In the penitential seasons (Advent and Lent), we will both likely be present for the full time. I will continue to hear the Friday morning confessions immediately following daily Mass.

Weddings and Funerals: We will continue to schedule as they come, but expect to once again have Mondays and Tuesdays as an option for funerals.

I am sure we will continue to make adjustments as we move ahead through the summer, but in general you can expect it to be very similar to what you were used to the past few years.

On a related subject, I want to say how deeply grateful I am to Msgr. Don Buxman and Fr. Francis Njau, AJ, for stepping in to offer our Monday and Tuesday daily Masses this past year! And, on those days when they or I were unavailable on our respective days, we regularly had Fr. Bruce Cwiekowski, Msgr. Dennis O'Donovan, and Fr. Hans to cover for us. It takes a village, as they say, and I'm grateful to all my brother priests for their help!

Congratulations to Keana Ada and Barnaby Lizama, who were married here on June 24th! Blessings to you both, and to all of our married and engaged couples.

Funeral services were held last week for Jack Dobler. We are also saddened to note the passing of parishioner Paul Christen. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace.

FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH: THOUGHTS ON FAITH

Do we ever think of God looking at us, seeing us? More than that, do we even think that God thinks about us at all? In my "moment" today (the bit of scripture sent to me by my Universalis App which it does throughout my day), I read this: "Lord, let your face shed its light upon us." And it stopped me, as I guess these moments are supposed to do.

I don't always stop. I generally look, read the *moment*, and move along with my day. It's rather like a drive-by spiritual experience. This morning was different. I thought about God in His infinite goodness, letting the light of His face, touch me.

We hear in scripture that when God's face shines upon us, He pours His goodness and grace into our lives. I imagine that God does this to us a lot, and in our distractions, our "busy"-ness and inattention, we miss it: the grace we are being offered.

In the book of Numbers, "The LORD said to Moses: 'Speak to Aaron and his sons and tell them: "This is how you shall bless the Israelites".'" (Nm 6:23) The Aaronic Blessing (Nm 6:24–26) is what our God is offering to all of us as His beloved children:

"The LORD bless you and keep you! The LORD let his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you! The LORD look upon you kindly, and give you peace!"

Thank God for daily reminders! May we be aware of the love and grace available to us every moment! Amen +

By the end of 2022, more than 100 million people were forcibly displaced globally, propelled by the war in Ukraine and other conflicts around the world. With a record number of people forced to leave their homeland, we must work together to bring hope and support to refugees by including them in the communities where they have found safety. Inclusion paves the way for long-term solutions for refugees and displaced people, allowing them to thrive in a new country or preparing them for a safe return to their home countries.

The number of families we serve continues to increase weekly, so whatever we collect from the garden is immediately given out and it usually will only last one serving day.


