GREETINGS FROM FR. BILL

This weekend (January 6–7), we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany — which means we also have our annual **Epiphany Party!** Please join us on Sunday at 12:30pm in the Cafeteria for lots of food, fun, and music. What a wonderful way to wrap up the holiday season! I also hear we may even have a visit from three kings. . .

Okay, **Liturgy Geek Time:** It is not Epiphany but the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord that marks the end of the Christmas season, which is. . . wait for it. . . Monday! So, on Tuesday, we begin Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time gets its name by the fact that we count the weeks. This coming week (beginning on Tuesday) is thus the First Week of Ordinary Time, and next Sunday will start the second week in Ordinary Time.

Unlike the other liturgical seasons (Lent, Easter, Advent, and Christmas), Ordinary Time is not marked by any distinctive character. Rather, note that in Ordinary Time, the Church sets before us the common life of Jesus — if one could actually say anything is “common” about Jesus’ life, as he taught, effected miracles, and lived among humanity in every way but sin!

Maybe you know this already, but the Sunday readings are divided into three years that we rotate between: A, B, and C. With the start of Advent last month, we entered into Year B. The weekday readings are broken into a two-year cycle (Cycle I and Cycle II). Beginning on Tuesday (January 9th) we embark on Cycle II. If one were to go to every Mass every day for three years, a person would have heard 71% of the entire Bible proclaimed to them. So, I guess that means each of us needs to read the remaining 29% on our own.

Hey! Maybe that could be your new year resolution. I would recommend simply tuning into Fr. Michael Schmitz's “Bible in a Year” podcast which will help you walk through the entirety of the Scripture much quickly and with excellent commentary. I cannot recommend it more highly! You can also check out his “Catechism in a Year” series, which just wrapped up last Monday. Ascension Press (the publishing company) has a free app you can download that includes both series, among many other features

(most are free, some are not) — you can get it at bit.ly/ascension-app. Both series are also linked on our YouTube Channel ([@HolyTrinityPDX](https://youtube.com/@HolyTrinityPDX)), under the “More Catholic Content: Video Series” section.

On the subject of social media: If you are not familiar with my personal media ventures, does it surprise you that a geek like me wouldn’t have just one, but several? If you are curious, feel free to check out frbill.org. There, you can find my various podcasts and YouTube videos (both at HT and years past); some photography (specifically astrophotography); links to my Facebook, X (formerly known as Twitter), Instagram, and Threads pages/accounts; and even a blog. You can simply subscribe to them or “follow” them and you will be alerted to anything new.

Lastly, on a personal note: Thank you to all who stepped up to give of yourselves this past Advent and Christmas season! So many people offered their gifts in quiet and unseen ways. You know who you are. Thank you! I want to also thank you for your kind Christmas cards. I typically wait until Christmas Day to open and read them. It has been a wonderful way to receive God’s love through you!

After all the Christmas Masses were completed, I came down with a cold which laid me low for several days afterwards. This is not uncommon for ministers in this season! I’m getting better, though I am surprised how long this cold has drawn out. I know that others have experienced similar. It was for this reason many of you may have noted that I did not post my weekly reflection video or regular podcast last week. No worries; they will be back soon!

May this new year bring you a deeper faith, surprise you by joy, and heal whoever wounds plague you. I desire that for myself. So, let’s all pray for each other and help reach out to those who need to hear the Gospel the most.

Funeral services are scheduled for Simon Dunlap this Friday, January 12th at 11:00am. May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace.

FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH: THOUGHTS ON FAITH

We Catholics celebrate *The Feast of the Epiphany* because something has been revealed. It comes from the Greek word "*epiphania*" meaning *profound unveiling*. We know the story about the Magi who were following that miraculous star in the sky. How long had the Magi been searching the night sky and studying the heavens, we aren't told. One would imagine that this was their life's work. In their reading of the signs in the night sky there was an intense manifestation, that beckoning star which captivated their imaginations, so they set off to see where it would lead them. Think further about the story: the Magi go looking for a **baby king, destined to be the Messiah, the king of the Jews**. And they found Him and were filled with the joy that only the experience of God can give us.

What should we hear in this story? A large part of the spiritual life is the searching for those *epiphanies*, those heightened experiences of the *good, the true, and the beautiful* that ultimately lead us to the source of all those things, namely, our God! We all have had those moments break into our lives when we least expect it. We can't control it or make it happen. Instead, we search, we wait for God to break in. For something to show itself so powerfully, it ultimately changes us and spurs us to **respond!** Like the Magi, we act!

Also like the Magi, this is our *spiritual life's* work! That's why we speak of prayer, day in and day out. Attending Mass, week in and week out. Returning again and again, eagerly expecting for God to speak to us. What do we do when we pray? We are being attentive, waiting for God's grace to break into our lives. When it does, like the Magi, we act. Once the Lord breaks into our life, we follow it all the way to the *Source which is God Himself*.

On this *Epiphany of the Lord*, may it be a reminder of the God who seeks to break into our lives to save us and set us free. *May it be our life's work to find that Christ and let Him in to save us! Amen! +*

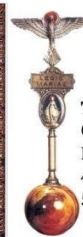
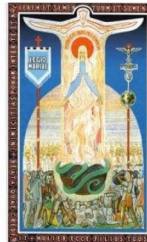

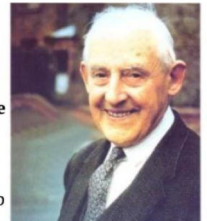

Legion of Mary's History

The Legion of Mary was founded in Dublin, Ireland on the 7th of September in 1921. It is a lay Catholic organization whose members are giving service to the Church on a voluntary basis in almost every country.

Legion of Mary's Aim

The object of the Legion of Mary is the Glory of God through the holiness of its members developed by prayer and active co-operation in Mary's and the Church's work.

Legion of Mary's Unit

The unit of the Legion of Mary is called a praesidium, which holds a weekly meeting, where prayer is intermingled with reports and discussion. Persons who wish to join the Legion must apply for membership in a praesidium.

Legion of Mary's Active Works

The Legion sees as its priority the spiritual and social welfare of everyone. The members participate in the life of the parish through visitation of families, the sick, both in their homes and in hospitals and through collaboration in every apostolate and missionary undertaking sponsored by the parish. The works are more of Spiritual Works of Mercy.

Legion of Mary's Active Membership

This membership is open to all faithfully practicing Catholics. Members attend weekly meetings (about an hour). They engage in prayers and active work. Candidates under 18 years of age can be received in Junior praesidia.

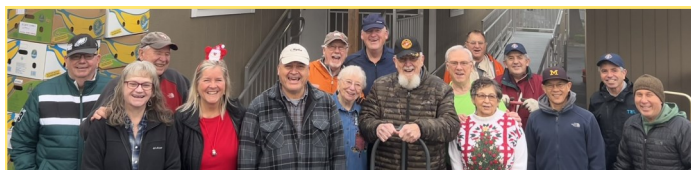

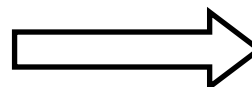
