BRETT'S TWO CENTS

Hello, everyone. One question that often comes up around Lent is how we arrive at the number 40, as in the short-change us, spiritually speaking? Well, dear 40 days of Lent. If you count the number of days from Ash Wednesday to Holy Thursday (which marks the end of Lent and the beginning of the Paschal Triduum), you get 43 days (44 if you end the Lenten fast on Holy Thursday with the Mass of the Lord's Supper).

"Ah, but Deacon Brett," you say. "You forgot that Sundays are not fast days! You need to remove those from your count."

Of course! So, if I count up the Sundays of Lent (there's six) and subtract them from 43 (or 44), I get. . . WAIT a minute, that gives me 37 (or 38) days! What gives?!?

At this point, silly liturgists would say something like, "Brett, Brett, Brett. '40' is symbolic, not a literal number. It refers back to the 40 days of the Flood, Israelites wandering in the desert for 40 years, Jesus' own 40 days in the wilderness, etc. '40' stands for a period of change or transformation. Don't be such a literalist nincompoop."

Well. I may be a literalist nincompoop, but dang it! I

want my 40 days! Would the Church really friends, you can relax. There really are (or were) 40 fast days during Lent.

You see, prior to the liturgical reforms following Vatican II, Lent didn't end until noon on Holy Saturday (Easter Vigil). So, if you add Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday (morning) to the tally of Lenten fast days, voilà - you get 40! But even today, after the reforms, it still works out. Although Lent proper ends on Holy Thursday, the three days prior to the Easter Vigil are still considered fast days — they are referred to as the Paschal Fast. So, if you take the 37 fast days of Lent and add the three fast days of the Paschal Fast, you still get 40 fast days total.

So glad we could get some clarity on this. This is what happens when I can't fall asleep at night due to the God-awful change from Standard Time to Daylight Saving Time. You're welcome!






